

NEW SCHOLARSHIPS EMPOWER MEDICAL STUDENTS TO SERVE INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

Right now, there are fewer than 10 medical doctors serving indigenous communities in Michigan. One generous donor has established a new scholarship to disrupt this trajectory.

The **Dr. Harry D. Brickley Endowed Scholarship in Human Medicine** was established with a \$100,000 gift from retired surgeon and friend of the college, Dr. Harry Brickley. The scholarship will provide endowed funding support to medical students interested in providing medical care to indigenous populations in Michigan.

To additionally bolster Dr. Brickley's scholarship, and address the gap in care specifically for indigenous populations, a second scholarship, the Mashkiki Endowed Scholarship in Human Medicine, has been established to provide an additional \$100,000 in matching endowed scholarship funds.

Mashkiki is the Ojibwe term for medicine—and is close to the donor's heart.

QUICK FACT ----

19% of MSU College of Human Medicine graduates (overall) practice in rural areas

Research has shown the trauma indigenous peoples have historically experienced—trauma which modifies the body's DNA—passes on to younger generations. Trauma, coupled with other social determinants of health experienced by diverse heritages, causes increased long-term negative health outcomes, like Type II diabetes.

Combined, these two scholarships will provide current medical students with an infusion of tuition support and will be awarded annually beginning in spring 2024.

Three MSU College of Human Medicine faculty received named endowed funds through the generous support of donors and friends. These are faculty who represent MSU's commitment to academic excellence and innovation, as well as donors who make a difference through supporting these esteemed, actively engaged research positions. The 2023 honorees are:



Nick Kanaan | Maibach Smiley Alzheimer's Research Professor

Nick Kanaan, PhD, is a professor and a leading expert in aging-related neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's disease, frontotemporal dementias, and the tau protein which

forms hallmark brain pathologies (tangles) of these diseases. Dr. Kanaan's goal is to improve the lives of people affected by devastating neurological diseases. He is world-renowned for his work on the underlying mechanisms of degenerative diseases and for creating novel antibodies. These antibodies have great potential to transform the clinical landscape. The Maibach Smiley professorship is made possible through the generosity of alumni couple Ben Maibach ('69, Engineering) and Barbara Maibach ('68, Natural Science), and will allow for Kanaan to hire top faculty, pursue ideas, and access resources.



Steve Ondersma | C.S. Mott Endowed Professor of Public Health

Steve Ondersma, PhD, is a clinical psychologist and professor at Michigan State University's Charles Stewart Mott Department of Public Health, with a secondary appointment in the

Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Biology. His research focuses on promoting maternal and child health and healthy birth outcomes using high-reach technology-delivered brief interventions. Dr. Ondersma has led multiple NIH and CDC studies focusing on developing, validating, and implementing novel screening techniques and electronic/mobile (mHealth) interventions in health care settings. The endowed professorship is supported by a generous gift from the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation, whose investments in the Flint community have changed countless lives.



Kurt Zinn | Hickman Family Endowed Chair in Oncology

Kurt R. Zinn, PhD, is a professor in the Departments of Radiology, Biomedical Engineering, and Small Animal Clinical Sciences. Dr. Zinn is also the director of nuclear medicine and investigator at the


Institute for Quantitative Health Science and Engineering (IQ). Zinn conducts research in the field of molecular imaging, including as part of cancer diagnosis and therapy and neuroimaging of drug delivery to the brain. With experience in more than 12 Phase 1 clinical trials, he expects to conduct clinical trials in both human and veterinary medicine. The Hickman Family Endowed Chair in Oncology was established by their Spartan family—daughter Stephanie Hickman Boyse (College of Communication Arts and Sciences, '90); daughter Tracy Hickman (Interior Design, '88); and Tracy's spouse, Chad Munger (College of Arts and Letters, '88)—to advance the standards of cancer care and fuel cutting-edge research.

Charles Stewart Mott Department of Public Health **Rx KIDS**

Led by Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha (CHM, 'O2), over \$43 million has been raised for Rx Kids, an innovative initiative to provide cash prescriptions to mothers in the City of Flint during pregnancy and throughout the first year of a child's life. The Charles Stewart Mott Foundation provided the inaugural \$15 million challenge grant. A \$55 million total investment is needed to fund five years of Rx Kids, with over 80% of funds going to cash prescriptions.

Many joined our founding donors and helped to close the funding gap. Thank you!

With a village of support, Rx Kids launched in January 2024. Rx Kids positions Flint and MSU as national leaders—sparking a powerful vehicle for health, hope, and opportunity.
